Improvements to school grounds

As you know over the last few weeks, we have had a little disruption to our outside play routine due to the grounds maintenance works going on. Two of our yards needed repair and the fence around the lower yard had been significantly damaged and required replacement. Thankfully most of the work is completed. However, we are still waiting for everything to be finished, including yard markings. Thank you for your understanding and patience in adhering to the temporary drop off and pick up arrangements. Everything we do is in the best interests of our children, and we will continue to update you with photos of the completed works as soon as everything is done.

Primary 1 2023 – 2024

Parents will be informed of the outcome of their application to primary school. There will be an information meeting for all parents of children starting Primary 1 in St Patrick's in September 2023 on Wednesday 10th May, 9:30am to 10:30am. Primary 7 Open Enrolment

Primary 7 pupils will be informed of the school they will be attending in Year 8 on 20th May. As our Primary 7 pupils embark on their last term of primary school, we wish them well and encourage them to continue reading and working to improve their literacy and numeracy skills ahead of end of year testing.

Anti-Bullying Survey

Thanks to those parents who responded to our survey which closed on 29th January. We are continuing to work on a revised policy which reflects new legislation and ensures all our children's needs are respected and protected. A big part of anti-bullying is firstly dealt with through our Positive Behaviour and Special Needs

practices, and it is important that our children know to report any behaviour that is a concern to them. Please remind them of this so that we can ensure any misunderstandings can be sorted out as soon as possible.

Reading

Thank you for supporting our annual book fair. Please continue to listen to your child read every day. Reading with your children from Primary 1 to Primary 7 is transformative for their academic success and personal wellbeing. We conducted the Boost Reading Programme over the last two terms and are delighted to inform you 25 pupils accessed this support and were rewarded with certificates and a treat for their hard work and achievement in the programme.

End of Year Testing

Primary 3 to Primary 7 pupils will be taking part in standardized assessments which will be reported in the Summer Reports. Please support your child in revising topics taught over the year in literacy and numeracy.

Market Day

To support our global goals in support of Fairtrade Fortnight, our Rights Respecting, ECO and School Council teams held a charity fundraiser for Trocaire on Thursday 2nd March and what an amazing day it was! Thanks to all our local traders who supported us and helped us raise £290.15 for Trocaire!

Bake Sales

Our boys and girls love baking at home and did extremely well, baking lots for our bun sales. Thanks to our families in Primary 5, 6 and 7 for the delicious, sweet treats we all enjoyed. They were simply delightful! Primary 5 and Primary 6 raised £1141.10 for Trocaire, and Primary 7 raised £760 for the Irish Pilgrimage Trust, Group 93. St Patrick's is a Nurturing School

As a Rights Respecting School, part of our School Development Plan is developing the principles of nurture. We believe children have the right to feel safe in school. Every classroom now offers a safe place in the form of a 'Calm Corner'. This is a quiet space which all children are welcome to use to help them feel regulated and ready to learn. Each safe space offers soft furnishings, sensory toys, weighted blankets, mindfulness activities and calming music. Calm Plan

St Patrick's PS prides itself on a Positive Behaviour Policy. Teachers have received training in the 'Calm Plan' approach. 'Calm Plan' helps adults recognise dysregulation in themselves and their pupils. We have developed an understanding of how to help pupils feel safe and connected. St Patrick's understands the process of developing a supported calm plan based on nurture principles and trauma informed practice.

Football Update

The boys' football team had two outings recently. They played in the Cumann na mBunscol indoor finals and gave a great account of themselves. Unfortunately, they were knocked out in the quarter final. They also had a playoff with Carrick in the Canon Esler competition. Again, they played well but missed a few scores which allowed Carrick to get a lead, and despite a great effort, St Patrick's could not recover. They will now play St Ronan's, Newry in the Shield final which will take place after Easter.

Rock Red Friday

Samantha, from the Children's Heartbeat Trust, visited our school to receive a cheque for £500 for her charity! The money was raised from our Rock Red Friday event. Visit from Deacon Gerry

The children sang songs and listened attentively to what Deacon Gerry said. Deacon Gerry reported that it was very evident that as a Catholic school there was lots of excellent learning going on at school and at home to help our children live a Christian life.

Strike Action by teachers

Teachers from all four teaching unions in Northern Ireland have been instructed to take a day of strike action on Wednesday 26^h April. This will mean St Patrick's PS will be closed for pupils on this day. Unfortunately, teachers, along with many other public sector services are having to make a stand because of pay conditions and funding cuts to school budgets which are having a major negative impact on our pupils' education.

Attendance

School App

Please make sure you have an updated version of the school app. If you are not getting regular notifications, please delete the app from your devices and download the app again, selecting the relevant onscreen options. Bus Lay-by

Please DO NOT park or turn your vehicle in the bus lay-by or along the front of the school. This area must be kept free of all traffic to ensure our children's safety. The pedestrian gate is open to facilitate children walking to and from school and is not for children getting dropped off or picked up by car. Please respect these rules. The lower church carpark should be used for parents/guardians to drop children off and pick children up.

Dropping Off and Picking Up

Thank you for following the one-way system on entering and exiting the church carpark. Please DO NOT STOP or wait in the YELLOW BOX at the top of the carpark. This is a major safety risk, and it inhibits our staff, support agencies and other families arriving on time. Please park in a space to drop your child to school and remind your children they should not climb on or over the walls at the Parochial House. Your children's safety is our number one priority at all times!

School dinners

All school dinners must be booked and paid through the online SchoolMoney system. Families entitled to free school meals must also use this system to book for the week ahead.
